


LIBERTY'S ST. GEORGE AND THE DRAGON.





The bridge connecting Liberty's famous Tudor building with their Regent Street premises is graced with a beautiful clock.

In the triple-arched canopy above the dial is seen St. George and the Dragon, a grouping which is reminiscent of the west gallery of St. George's Hall, Windsor Castle. The dragon is a fearsome beast in green and gold, while St. George is a knightly figure, armed cap-a-pie on a white charger. When at rest the two figures remain in full view. At a quarter past the hour the dragon flees, with St. George in pursuit. One circuit is made at the first quarter, two at the half-hour, three at three-quarters. It is always a chase, but not a hopeless one. Although the handicap of the pursuer appears to increase, the dragon is held fast at the fourth circuit at the hour, and St. George victoriously prods him at each stroke of the bell. Every hour the dragon is vanquished before the eyes of a delighted audience.

The design and execution of the electro-mechanical installation was the work of Mr. F. Hope-Jones, M.I.E.E., F.R.A.S., being carried out by the Synchronome Co., Ltd.



